

Examination Results and Destination of Leavers 2019



Once again Woldingham girls achieved some great A Level and GCSE results in 2019. I am so proud of all the girls who took external exams this year.

Looking at the headline results, across all A Levels 47% of the grades were at A-A*, while at GCSE more than half of the year group achieved seven or more 9-7 grades. These are superb achievements in an era when specifications have been reformed into linear qualifications with an emphasis on increased rigour. Reviewing the results in a little more detail shows real areas of strength. In A Level Art, 70% of grades were A*-A, while in the separate science GCSEs, 92% of results were graded 9-7. Those Upper Sixth girls taking an EPQ clearly relished their independent research, with 45% of grades at A*.

Behind these headlines lies a great deal of hard work and dedication from the girls, coupled with the commitment and teaching excellence from our staff in preparing the girls for the exams, and support from friends, families and the whole Woldingham community over this period of intense study. It's worth remembering that Woldingham is not, and never will be, a 'hot house'. We are proud to select girls with a range of academic abilities and to see them flourish in a healthy environment of scholarship

and academic excellence. I am sure you will join me in congratulating them.

Many of our Sixth Formers who left Woldingham this summer are now getting ready to start their next adventure at university. Durham is our most popular destination this year, with seven girls starting undergraduate degrees there. The breadth of subjects chosen for degree level study is immense; from Medicine through to Criminology; and from Law to Art. As a chemistry graduate, I am delighted that six of our leavers have chosen chemistry related degrees! That aside, it demonstrates the huge choice available to our girls from the extensive range of academic and co-curricular options at Woldingham.

Let's take a moment to celebrate the achievements of all of our girls, from Year 7 through to our leavers, as we continue our vision to provide an outstanding education that empowers women to change the world.
