From her first role in Year 7 when she starred in Joseph and his Amazing Technicolor Coat through to her final performances in the Upper Sixth, Rachel shone on stage at Woldingham's Dineen auditorium.

Rachel said some of her personal highlights included: *'the in between moments before going on stage for a production when we were being hushed in the wings and there's a sort of buzz in the air. And seeing teachers get passionate about the things they were teaching us about.'*
